Every child of God is given the gift of God's Spirit when they come to faith.

But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law...

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2) Indulging sin to satisfy its desires

"Indulging the flesh never satisfies it, but inflames it!" "...the flesh is a primordial self-righteousness that rejects salvation by sheer grace and insists on self-salvation and thus turns some good thing into an idol-savior which we then 'over-desires.'

All of our worries, fears, bitterness and entrenched bad habits come from these over-desires...The flesh's over-desires arise from a heart that is afraid to trust God and desires rather to be its own Savior and Lord."

## How do we keep from gratifying the desires of the sinful nature?

A) Living by the Spirit (v16)!

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- The Spirit moves us to love people and not conquer tasks
- Whenever you see someone doing a selfless act, it's likely, of the Spirit
- The clearest identifier of God's people is not those who are determined to be right, but those who are determined to serve others

"Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, provoking and envying each other."

"Do not use your freedom to indulge the sinful nature; rather, serve one another in love. The entire law is summed up in a single command: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' If you keep on biting and devouring each other, watch out or you will be destroyed by each other."

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Sexual sins - sexual immorality, impurity, debauchery

Religious sins - idolatry, witchcraft

Relationship sins - hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions, envy

Substance abuse sins - drunkenness, (drinking) orgies

Is your life characterized by these attitudes and behaviors?

"I warn you, as I did before, that those who live like this will not inherit the kingdom of God."

So, what fruit is your life bearing?

When was the last time you sat in the presence of your Savior and truly worshipped?
If you don't make this a regular practice, you will quickly focus on yourself and live for yourself.

"A human being who is not living in the functional awe of God is a profoundly disadvantaged human being. He is off the rails, trying to pull the train of his life in a meadow, and he may not even know it. The spiritual danger here is that when awe of God is absent, it is quickly replaced by awe of ourselves. If you are not living for God, the only alternative is to live for yourself...

You see, the biggest protection against the kingdom of self is a heart that's so blown away by the right here, right now glories of the grace of Jesus Christ that we're not easily seduced by the lesser temporary glories of the claustrophobic kingdom of one—the kingdom of self!"
